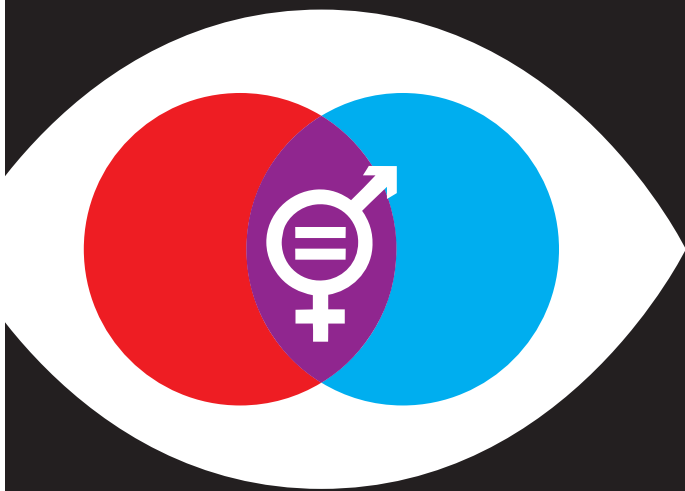


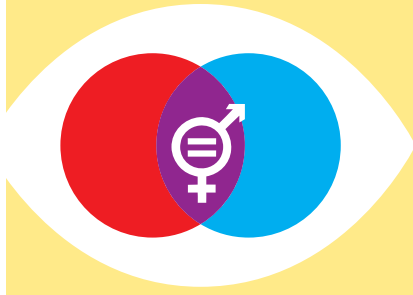

## ABOUT THE SPEAKERS

**Congressman Tim Bishop** has been New York's First Congressional District representative since 2002. A 12th generation Long Islander, his focus is protecting Long Island's middle-class families. Congressman Bishop's priorities in Congress include reforming health care, improving the economy, and fighting for veterans. Congressman Bishop is a member of the House Transportation and Infrastructure Committee, the Education and Labor Committee, and the Budget Committee.

**Dr. Janine Austin Clayton, MD**, was named Deputy Director, Office of Research on Women's Health (ORWH), Office of the Director at the National Institutes of Health in June 2008. A board certified ophthalmologist, Dr. Clayton has been an attending physician and clinical investigator in cornea and uveitis at the NEI since 1996. She currently serves on several committees including the board of directors of Women in Ophthalmology and the executive committee of Women's Eye Health.Org.

**Dr. Louis Pizzarello, MD, MPH**, is the Chairman of VISION 2020/USA and immediate-past Secretary General of the International Agency for the Prevention of Blindness. He has worked in blindness prevention programs in 40 countries with a particular interest in cataract programs, nutritional and childhood blindness, and the prevention of eye injuries. He has practiced ophthalmology for the past 25 years in Southampton, NY, and is currently associate clinical professor of ophthalmology and public health at the College of Physicians and Surgeons of Columbia University as well as adjunct assistant professor of preventive medicine at SUNY/Stony Brook.

**Jennifer Klein** is a Senior Advisor on Global Women's Issues in the Office of Global Women's Issues at the Department of State. She focuses primarily on global health issues. Prior to joining the State Department, from 1999 until May 2009, she was a consultant to foundations and non-profit organizations on children's, women's and health issues. From 1993 through 1998 Jennifer worked at the White House as a Special Assistant to the President for Domestic Policy – functioning both as First Lady Hillary Rodham Clinton's domestic policy advisor and as a member of the Domestic Policy Council staff. She focused on health care, child care, early childhood development, adoption and child welfare, and other children's issues.
