ASCO's member schools and colleges are proud to be playing a growing role through NEI-supported research in the battle against vision impairment and eye disease. In 2006-2007, ASCO member institutions were engaged in 116 NEI funded research projects totaling over \$23 million, which represents our members' largest source of research support.
